Her current practice examines the personal inner world with identity exploration through cultural differences and universal values. Her recent solo show, The Invisible which premiered at The blue Elephant Theatre in London, tells a personal story of what it is like to live in a foreign country.

theatre companies and artists who would like
to spend a week at The HopBarn developing a
new work for the annual Departure Lounge

This will be the 3rd year that The HopBarn has supported Derby Theatre's Departure Lounge Festival and as with previous years, there were a number of applications received ranging from solo performances that challenged status and identity to more collective group pieces focussing on the philosophical as well as the political.

Sunday 22nd July 2018.

Following a series of short listed interviews, the Package Holiday opportunity was awarded to Cheeky Chin Theatre Company, a company

and freedom, violence and devotion is told, reflecting on Brexit with a unique East Asian perspective.

Inspired by Theresa May's recent visit to China, the semi-solo performance will feature mundane monologues, human-siri dialogues and the use of fruits with distinct smells to juxtapose the subjective multiple realities in intimate relations leading to the passion and war between lovers. The interaction between the performer and the technician will be highlighted with the technician's stepping onto stage and triggering the time frame of the scenario. The performer plays opposite the audience and the technician within the work to detail the intertwining relations between the two invisible characters and address their visibility in the space.

The performer uses physical movements that blur the boundaries of self and others, memories and imaginations, to symbolize and, more significantly, complicate the nature of intimate relations. The performer also applies multimedia measures, such as recorded footage, live feed, repetitions of multimedia texts, to create a deconstructed space-time of mixed thoughts and emotions.

In this post-Brexit, post-truth era, the production strikes a balance between particularity and universality, arts and politics through the lens of cultural intersection. As the audience are gradually led into the play, they open up a possibility of discovering how the heightened gendered, racialized and classed social expectations in the new global context permeate into the most intimate relationships from an outsider's perspective, not only for the two persons in the relationship, but also for nations in the world.

The work to be developed as part of Derby Theatre's Departure Lounge Festival, continues the theme initiated by Yuyu during her solo work that premiered at The Blue Elephant, although current political changes will undoubtedly affect foreign citizens and *Open Wound* looks to tackle such affects head on.

This is potentially a challenging work that offers The Departure Lounge Festival a significant piece of original theatre as well as offering audience members something to really think about and contemplate both during and after the work has been premiered.

For Yuyu and Cheeky Chin, the Package Holiday opportunity provides additional Research and Development time aside from their given offer provided by the Royal Central School of Speech and Drama (RCSSD). Here they are looking for Derby Theatre to challenge their ideas and push their creative theatre practice to enable the work to achieve a deeper and more complex perspective of the central theme.

The HopBarn is both delighted and excited that Cheeky Chin were selected to undertake the Package Holiday opportunity and we would like to congratulate Yuyu and the company in their successful application,
